About the presenter:

Dr. R. Michael Paige, Emeritus Professor of International and Intercultural Education, University of Minnesota, has been an intercultural educator since 1968, when he began working with the U.S. Peace Corps on their cross-cultural training. For his first 16 years at Minnesota he also served as the Associate Director for the Office of International Education (now the International Student and Scholar Services). His numerous publications include *Student Learning Abroad: What Our Students are Learning, What They're Not, and What We Can Do About It* (Stylus, 2012), *Culture as the Core: Perspectives in Second Language Acquisition* (Information Age Publishing, 2003), *Maximizing Study Abroad* (2nd ed. U. Minnesota, 2006), and *Education for the Intercultural Experience* (Intercultural Press, 1993).
